




Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo

(B.P.P.V.)

Degeneration of the salt-like crystals (otoliths) in the utricle which break free and float into or attach to the semicircular canals. Symptoms include: attacks of vertigo with rapid, pitched head motion, e.g., rolling in or out of bed or simply looking up.



Treatment Options Include:

- Canalith Repositioning
 - Semont Liberatory Maneuver
 - Gans Repositioning Maneuver
 - Epley-Herdman Maneuver
- Improve and Stabilize Vitamin D Level
